#### NAPLAN 2024 student readiness

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope your child is settling in well in their new school year.

This term, your child will undertake <u>NAPLAN assessment</u>. NAPLAN provides schools with valuable information about your child's learning progress in literacy and numeracy. NAPLAN is only one way we assess student learning in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9.

NAPLAN will take place from Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March in 2024.

Your child's teacher is getting students ready for NAPLAN and will provide appropriate support and guidance. Students will become familiar with the types of questions in the tests and the online testing platform that we use. In addition to school preparation, I want to share with you some information on how you can further support your child for NAPLAN.

#### Preparation for NAPLAN

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN and do not need excessive preparation or the use of services by coaching providers. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program. If you or your child/children would like to know more about the NAPLAN online platform you can go to the <u>public demonstration site</u> and do some practice tests and <u>past NAPLAN papers</u> are also available online.

#### Participation in NAPLAN

Adjustments are available for students who have diverse functional abilities and needs. On a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments for individual students can be made so they can complete NAPLAN. Speak to your child's teacher to discuss the adjustments available. For more information read the <u>Guide for schools to assist students with disability to access NAPLAN (PDF 96 KB).</u>

#### Assessment tips

You can support your child by reminding them to simply do their best. You can also encourage:

- a healthy diet
- drinking lots of water
- limiting caffeine (students in Year 7 and 9 only)
- · getting enough sleep
- exercise and relaxation time

These, along with arriving at school on time ready to sit the test will help prepare our school to bring their best on the day.

## TROPICAL FRUIT WORLD EXURSION

The Stage 5 Food Technology and Agriculture classes went to Tropical Fruit World on Wednesday to explore new amazing and interesting fruits and learn about their origins and how they are farmed.

We had a very knowledgeable tour guide named Andy who showed us the different directions the crops were planted in order to manipulate their growth and fruiting to ensure an all-year round crop. Andy spoke about the different soil types and qualities, and we learnt that avocado trees are planted on mounds as they don't like wet roots.

We explored the packing shed, learning about the industrial side; how the fruits are sorted and stored and distributed and used not just for their fresh food market but in their cafe, as well as made into beauty products and garnishes.

The students went on a tractor ride, sightseeing all the different trees, learning there are over 23000 avocado trees, with many different varieties on the farm.

There was a petting zoo with chickens, sheep and goats getting lots of snacks and cuddles from the students.

A fun boat ride took us to an island with indigenous foods and recreational activities that kept everyone amused.

The tour was wrapped up with a fruit tasting and then everyone was able to explore the fruit market and cafe, indulging in a tropical infused lunch.
