

Ultimately, play should involve some degree of agency, enabling children to take on an active role and ownership in their experiences, as well as recognising and trusting children to be capable, autonomous, and agents of their own learning.

I am looking forward to seeing what 2022 has in store for us!











YEAR 5/6 - Jo Mackney

This Term Year 5 - 12 students have been helping to imagine and design a new high school library area. We will be using some of their wonderful ideas when revamping the library soon.




A big thank you to the P&C Committee, who have generously provided funding so we can provide all primary students with a library bag next year, which they will get to personalise with fabric paint.


