FROM THE DEPUTY

Jingela,

Welcome back to the 2024 school year.

Once again we are excited by the year ahead and continuing our commitment to innovation and engagement.

We have some exciting things happening Term 1, driven mostly by our student body and young leaders in the school.

We plan to reinvigorate our student management and behaviour policies which will now be called Foundations For Success. As part of this the rewards system will be improved to ensure our focus is on rewarding outstanding behaviour and achievement rather than our system just recording negative incidents.

On top of the behaviour/ learning rewards, our attendance team will announce Attendance Awards soon. These will be for students who attend school on a regular basis. Data shows that strong school attendance supports greater academic success, personal wellbeing and increases their career life options.

Last year we started these innovations by introducing a whole school three house system. People may remember we use to have two houses in Primary- Green and Gold and four houses in Secondary- Red/Blue/ Yellow and Green or Guramen/Julum/ Miwan and Yambah. As we have furthered the idea of becoming one school, a Central School, rather than a primary and secondary school, we have merged the whole school into three houses based on the student surname. YUMBAH AH (Snake) Green/ MIWAN I- Pq (Eagle) yellow and GURUMEN Pr- Z (Kangaroo) Red.

Students can contribute to house points in the classroom/ playground/ sports/ citizenship and lots of other ways. At the end of every term the winning house will have a reward- decided by the student body.

We are really excited to get a rewarding system going that encourages participation/ effort and excellence for all. We have amazing learners that do incredible things.

We are continuing our engagement with the 4C Organisation, although scaled back in 2024, as we focus on embedding collaboration/ communication/ critical reflection and creativity in all aspects of our school. PRIMARY NEWS

Kindergarten have had an incredible start to their learning journey at school. Years 1 and 2 have supported them inside and outside of the classroom to make new friends, share their ideas and feel safe and confident in their new environment.

In our K-2 Math Unit, we have been exploring representing whole number using varying materials, shape characteristics and social math games when ordering numbers.

For our first K-2 English Unit, we explored how the students get ready for school. The Wild Guide to Starting School by Laura Bunting is our supporting text. We discussed how we all felt on our first day with many students relaxing after they had shared feelings amongst the group.

Our Kindergarten phonics program is Initial Lit. The program starts with learning about syllables and rhyme. Years 1 and 2 phonics program is Soundwaves. The program is supported by multimedia explicit lessons combined with focus words to support new sounds and literacy skills.

Our K-2 class have made their own set of expectations for each other and are thriving in the ownership and helpful roles they have created for their classroom.

We do have a change to the K/1 timetable. K/1 Library lesson with Miss Sara is now on Friday afternoons. Reading books with your child is a great way to support their developing literacy skills and love of learning.

If your child has a lunch order, please provide fruit / snack for the morning 1st break. Primary students do not have access to the canteen at this time. Our typical daily routine is:

K-6 Primary morning muster

1st session: Phonics program / literacy

2nd session: English lesson 3rd session: Math lesson

4th session alternates between: Choir / Rock and Water / Science / Library / Sport / Creative arts.

We are looking forward to the term ahead and to working closely with you throughout the year.

The Swimming Carnival was a huge success, with around a third of the High School in attendance, which is so amazing!


It's so great to see fellow students get excited about school sporting events and representing their house colours.




