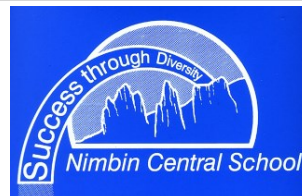

From the Relieving Deputy Principal

Hi everyone!

Last week of term is coming up fast and I know that everyone is looking forward to the holidays for a well-earned rest. Eleven week terms can feel like a bit of a marathon!

Coming up next term are some important milestone testing for a large number of our students. In Weeks 4 and 5 students from Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be undertaking their Naplan tests. All tests will now be completed online, which means that the results of the tests will be available much sooner than we have had them in the past.

Whilst we understand that for some students Naplan tests are a source of stress and anxiety, we really do encourage all students to complete them. The reason for this is that it gives our teachers objective data that matches the progress of our students against students from across NSW and the rest of Australia. We are able to use this data to identify individual student's strengths and areas for improvement, and plan teaching programs accordingly.

In Week 5 of next term Year 10 and 11 students will be undertaking their HSC Minimum Standards tests. From 2020, students have to meet certain benchmarks in Literacy and Numeracy on these tests in order to be eligible for an HSC Certificate. Many of our current Year 11 students completed these tests last year and have already passed, so they will not need to do them again.

Please be advised that there is no need to panic if a student does not pass these tests the first time, as they can be attempted as many times as needed in order to reach the benchmarks. At Nimbin Central, students that do not pass them the first time will be given extra tutoring before having another attempt later in the year.

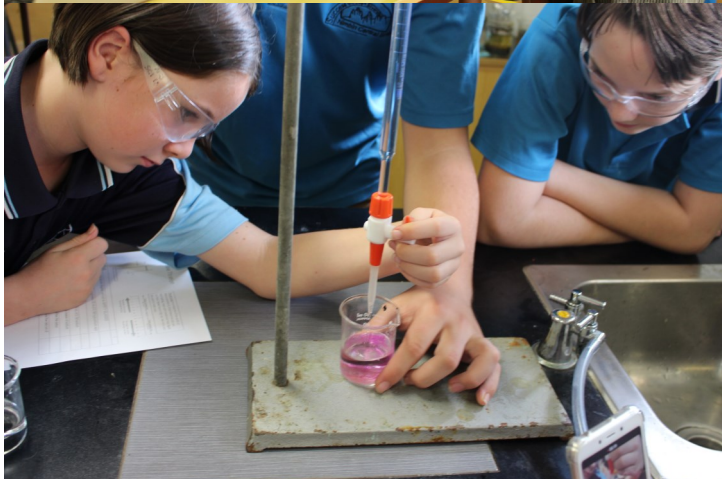

Terms and Conditions

By entering the Competition (the 160 Litre Challenge), you agree to these Terms and Conditions. Rous County Council is the organiser of the Competition. Ballina Shire Council, Byron Shire Council, Lismore City Council and Richmond Valley Council will promote the competition on behalf of Rous County Council (a Participating Council).

Eligibility Entry is limited to residents who currently reside within the Ballina Shire, Byron Shire, Lismore City or Richmond Valley Council areas of NSW, Australia. Employees and immediate family members of employees of Rous County Council and Participating Councils are ineligible to enter the Competition.
