

#### K—6 NEWS

It's great to have everyone settled back into the routines of school so smoothly even though we had a slight glitch with the wet last week.

#### Collection of K-2 children at the end of the School Day

Child safety is a core part of Nimbin Central School's Priorities. Strategies and plans are reviewed regularly to ensure a culture of child safety is embedded in all areas of school.

Please note, as part of our safeguarding procedures, a child can only go home with the usual person who collects the child. If someone different is collecting him/her, the school is to be informed beforehand by the child's parent. **No child** will be sent home with another person without the school receiving at least verbal permission from a person with parental responsibility. We **will not** send a child home with someone else even if they are known to the staff member/school unless this has been communicated to the school first. When informing the school, parents should indicate if this is an on-going arrangement or a one-off situation. Children must be collected by someone over the age of 14 years.

In the event of a parent/carer being late for pickup, your child will be taken to the administration office where parents and emergency contacts will be called. It is important for all parents and carers to ensure that they have provided up-to -date contact details.

#### **Collection Area for K-2**

All Junior Primary K-2 students are to be collected from the inside courtyard, outside the school administration office. Kindergarten have been collected from this area already. K-2 students must be collected by an adult or someone over the age of 14years.

Students who catch a bus home will meet the supervising teacher at this checkpoint and will then be escorted together to the bus bay.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation in these matters and helping make transition times safer and more effective.

#### "Help us to help your child!"

Some housekeeping problems have presented themselves during the course of the day. The first one is money. Many students come to school with loose money—notes and change with no purse/wallet or bag to keep it safe. Loose money falls out of pockets or bags too easily and it's upsetting for them when they have lost their money and are not able to purchase at the canteen. For the little ones especially it's a big ask to entrust them with loose money and on many occasions money is lost. Please help them by ensuring that money comes to school in a purse or wallet.

Thank you for the wonderful effort parents place in providing healthy lunches. Just a reminder: could you supply spoons when your child has yoghurt, baked beans, tuna etc and a piece of fruit or snack for break time at 10.15am during the morning sessions. Some students regularly have nothing to eat during this break.

It's a lot easier to find the owner of an item if it is labelled. We ask can all personal belongings, clothing, hats, bags and stationery be labelled. There is a large amount of lost property within the school and of course a name will help us find the owner.

Thank you for your co-operation in ensuring students are at school on time ready for learning. As always if you have any queries or concerns please contact the school.

#### **Meet and Greet**


