As the end of Term 1 approaches, we see the completion of the Year 11 subjects morph into Year 12 for our Stage 6 student's learning as they transition into their HSC pattern of study. This transition highlights the importance of continuing to maintain our culture of high expectations whilst fostering a safe and supportive environment for all.

Nimbin Central School is committed to student safety and well-being, looking towards the implementation of new directions with student wellbeing at the centre. These include the update of our mobile phone procedures using Yondr (more information will come from this space shortly), closing the bathrooms during class times (trial proposed by P&C), revisiting and reminding all of our students of the dress code (information in today's newsletter) and re-structuring the administration space including relocation of our student medical centre. Nimbin Central's Student Dress Code

Although we do not enforce a strict uniform policy here at Nimbin Central School, we do have a Dress Code in the school that students are expected to abide by.

Our "new" Nimbin Central School shirt was released in 2023. The design was created by Uncle Gilbert Laurie. Built upon a "Nimbin blue" background, our beautiful and unique shirt incorporates the three valleys of Nimbin, Tuntable, Crofton and Sam's Gully, features a rainbow to celebrate the diversity of our "Rainbow Region" and shows Nimbin Rocks, which is such a unique feature of our school's landscape.

There is one shirt design for all students, from Kindergarten to Year 12. Please also note that, due to the recent change, students may wear any of the former Nimbin School shirt designs.

The following are some of the uniform guidelines that we expect our students to follow:

- We encourage students to wear the school shirt each day, however this is a mandatory requirement when travelling on school excursions or when representing the school.
- Clothing should be clean, safe, modest and in reasonable condition.
- Covered footwear must be worn at all times and be appropriate for practical subjects.
- No inappropriate clothing should be worn. This includes clothing displaying unacceptable
 messages or images, "strappy" singlets, tank tops (bare midriffs), "short" shorts and other
 clothing considered immodest or inappropriate for the learning environment.
- As a Sun Smart school, we also encourage students to also wear a hat when outdoors and apply sunscreen as needed throughout the day. Primary school enforces a "no hat, no play" policy.

We are proud of our school, and we'd love to see all students wearing our school uniform.



K/2 News

We're thrilled to have our class back together after the recent weather event. Harmony Day was a fantastic experience that brought our buddy reading groups together for a series of engaging activities. Students rotated through three stations: a fun sports game, a collaborative group poster project, and a creative "Belonging Hands" activity. Throughout the day, our mixed peer groups supported one another, sharing stories, laughter, and teamwork. It was wonderful to see students connecting and celebrating the spirit of inclusiveness and belonging.

Our current focus in Maths is exploring measurement through volume and capacity. Recently, our Year 1 and 2 students took on an exciting challenge: designing vessels they estimated would hold exactly 30 crystals. The results were wonderfully creative, with students constructing a variety of shapes, including rectangles and cones. This hands-on activity encouraged students to apply their measurement skills while sparking curiosity and creativity. They also explored representing numbers in various shapes. The number 77 was demonstrated as a house and differing shapes.


Lawn Bowl Trials



STEM LEARNING

We are embarking on an exciting hands-on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) project at Nimbin Central School, constructing a 6-meter geodesic dome! This innovative structure allows students to explore engineering, mathematics, and sustainability in action. Designed as both a collaborative learning experience and a functional addition to our school, the dome will initially be used as a greenhouse.

The project's first stage kicked off with enthusiastic Year 5 and 6 students getting their hands dirty as they helped prepare the site. Working together with the help of some older students, they dug drainage trenches, laid pipes, and filled them with gravel to ensure the dome's foundation remains dry and stable. This initial groundwork not only introduced students to basic civil engineering concepts but also highlighted teamwork and problem-solving skills in a practical setting. Stay tuned as we continue building this incredible structure!





Please return your child's forms no later than Friday the 2nd of May.










